### POLICY & REGULATIONS COMMITTEE (PRC) REPORT

Dr. Booker presented the certification, inspections and audit report.

The following was offered by Dr. Booker in the form of a Motion, second by Mr. Carrera:

- 1. <u>Motion</u>: As a result of 100% compliance with Board standards, I MOVE unconditional certification for the following facilities:
  - i. Henrico County Regional Jail East
  - ii. Henrico County Regional Jail West

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Unanimous approval.

The following was offered by Dr. Booker in the form of a Motion, second by Mrs. Vermont:

- 2. <u>Motion</u>: As a result of 100% compliance with Board standards, I MOVE suspension of the 2024 annual inspections for the following facilities:
  - i. Henrico County Regional Jail East
  - ii. Henrico County Regional Jail West

Unanimous approval.

Dr. Booker reported the Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) implementation process is proceeding and she saluted the extraordinary efforts of BLRJ staff on the project. 7 BLRJ guidance documents were repealed in December 2024, with 4 remaining. 6VAC15-40-1045 Supervision of Inmates guidance was effective December 19, 2024. The BLRJ by-laws are pending review and research by the Committee. PRC recommends committee membership be included on committee agenda.

### JAIL REVIEW COMMITTEE (JRC) REPORT

Case recommendations

1. Mr. Sherrod read the Motion as follows:

The JRC investigated the following cases by reviewing institutional, medical, and mental health records and other relevant evidence of the circumstances surrounding each death. The JRC finds that investigation did not reveal any evidence indicating that the facility was out of compliance with the regulations promulgated by the Board. NOW THEREFORE, I **MOVE** that the following cases be recommended to the Board for closure:

The Jail Review Committee investigated the following cases by reviewing institutional, medical, and mental health records and other relevant evidence of the circumstances surrounding each death. The Jail Review Committee finds that the investigation did reveal evidence indicating that the facility was out of compliance with the regulations promulgated by the Board. However, the Jail Review Committee finds that the corrective actions taken by the jail appropriately address the substance of the violation such that

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no further measures are necessary. NOW THEREFORE, I <u>MOVE</u> that the following cases be recommended to the Full Board for closure: *Case number 23-0022*
